**Palm Sunday Drive-In Service
Our Savior's North Parking Lot
April 5, 2020**

Thank you for coming to worship with us today! This is a new experience for all of us and we want to be ready to do it well next week for Easter Sunday. So today we may need to identify and troubles and work them out so that next week goes more smoothly. Please be patient with us.

When you came into the parking lot, the ushers should have directed you as to where to park. This is so that we get larger vehicles in the back and smaller vehicles in the front.

When the service is completed, please wait to be directed as to when to pull out so that we can exit safely. Please drop your offering in the plate held by the ushers as you exit the parking lot.

This service does not include Holy Communion, however, for those who wish to receive the Lord's Supper today, the front doors to the church will be propped open. You may wait in the parking area or you may remain in your vehicle until called. Some may need to move their vehicle in order for others to exit the parking lot. We will have about 10 people at a time come into the church narthex and form a line. Families may stand together, but please keep distance between others.

The pastor will speak the Words of Institution for each group and then one pastor will place the Body of Christ into your hand and the other pastor will hand you an individual cup. The group will be dismissed with the usual words and then please exit the narthex for the next group to enter.

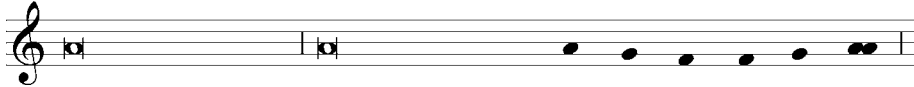

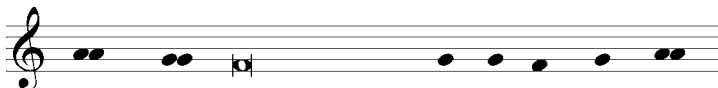

Confession of Faith (Creed of Nicea)

- C** I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life ✝ of the world to come. Amen.
