From Pastor Lauer

The book of Ecclesiastes tells us "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (3:1)

Really? Is there a proper time to kill, break down, hate, wage war and even a time to die? How can any of these things *ever* be appropriate or proper? And what about this pandemic? We are sure to exceed 200,000 deaths just in the USA by the end of this month. Is there a season and a time for a pandemic?

The Bible often doesn't tell us why things happen or what God accomplishes through them, but God is very down-to-earth in acknowledging that they do happen on account of sin and evil. Jesus told the disciples, "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place." (Matthew 24:6)

The Good News of God in Jesus, Our Savior, isn't that our lives will go smoothly once He makes us His own. Rather, the Good News is that this world – and the troubles that come – will not overcome us because He has overcome the world. He has promised to one day take each of us "from this veil of tears" to the New Creation where all these troubles will be no more.

In the meantime, we live by faith not in what we see or experience but by faith in the Word and Promises of Jesus who loved us and gave His life for us. We live by faith given and supported by the Holy Spirit who calls us to hear and receive the Gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

During these troubled times, many people have had to reach deep into their spiritual reserves while waiting to be filled again through Word and Sacrament. If your spiritual reserves are running dry, please call one of our pastors or our deaconess to see how we can help you be filled again. Private meetings and home visitations are available for those who cannot attend one of our weekly services.

What's Ahead for our Worship Schedule?

We are continuing all three Sunday Services – indoors at 8:00 and 10:30 with masks and distancing as well as the 9:15 parking lot service. Broadcasts of previously recorded services continue on local cable TV and are posted to our website. What will happen when we can no longer be outside? We're still working on that, but it may be necessary to add additional indoor services. We'll keep you posted as circumstances change and plans develop.

Coming Soon: we will switch to a <u>live streaming</u> broadcast of our Sunday 10:30 service through our website which will be available for play-back on Sunday afternoons and will be broadcast at the regular times on KTV local access channels. We are waiting for the computer hardware to arrive and we will make announcements before the switch. This will replace the previously recorded services we have been replaying for the past six months.

Please Be Careful not to rely upon video services if you are able to attend in person since Holy Communion with our Lord and the Communion of Saints are essential to keeping the faith and "keeping the Sabbath Day holy." For those who have no other options, pastoral care is also available at home or by phone. Just please be careful not to let the convenience of video worship keep you away *when you could attend* or you may risk falling away from the habit of gladly hearing and learning the Word and receiving the sacrament.

Boiler Room Flood. Record rains on July 26th flooded our boiler room and the hall of our downstairs class rooms. An insurance claim has been filed and the Trustees are working diligently with contractors and the insurance company to replace and repair equipment and flooring. Built on the Rock the Church shall stand Even when steeples are falling. Crumbled have spires in every land; Bells still are chiming and calling, Calling the young and old to rest, But above all the souls distressed, Longing for rest everlasting. - LSB 645 v.1

Times are tough for the Church. Attendance numbers aren't what they used to be. Buildings, activities, and members age and decay. While many of the most powerful and prosperous nations in the world used to consider themselves part of the quilt of Christendom most if not all of those nations now scoff at the very idea of counting themselves as part of a larger Christian culture. Those that remain are refugees of days gone by, times that are no longer present but have faded into obscurity. And that is to say nothing of global pandemics and their fallout.

This hymn acknowledges all of that. But it also calls the Church to recognize something far more important than that: that she is built on the Rock. That Rock is Christ the founder and perfecter of our faith (Heb. 12:2). He is the foundation of the one holy Christian Church. He, not numbers, influence, riches, or buildings determines our success and victory. And He has promised us that despite how things look even hell itself will never prevail against His most beloved Bride (Matt. 16:18).

So take heart, people of God! Your Lord is the Rock! He has called you into His one holy Church! He has placed you onto the most solid of foundations that is un-shakable, even by the devil! Take refuge in that Church by partaking in the precious gifts of God, His Word and sacraments. No matter how things look yesterday, today, or tomorrow rest assured that the Church will stand forever! Because she is built on the Rock.


