I am often amazed when I think of the life of the Apostles. They came from humble beginnings. Mostly they were unimportant people from unimportant villages in an unimportant country. They were not particularly powerful or eloquent or intelligent. They were loved by their families and likely their local communities but were basically unknown outside of their own immediate circle.

But from the moment they met Jesus their lives changed forever. They heard the Lord speak, they saw His miracles, they lived their lives with Him. They followed Him. And because of all that the Lord took their lives and made them something astounding. They shared their lives with Jesus with the world. Through their writings, their preaching, and their fellowship in the Church the Holy Spirit brought Christ to the world.

I am even more amazed when I reflect on the fact that everything that I just said about the Apostles is also true of us. We are mostly unimportant people from mostly unimportant places. We are loved by our family and friends, but relatively unknown to the outside world. But we also have encountered the Lord Jesus. We have heard His Word. We have seen His miracles. We live our lives with Him as we follow Him. And as we take the all this that He has proclaimed to us and proclaim it to those around us He also transforms our lives from something seemingly unimportant to something of eternal importance.

All that is to say: contract with Jesus changes people. Then those people pass along the story of their encounter with the Lord which causes other people to encounter the Lord and the process continues in an unbroken chain from the first Apostles all the way down to us. Our place is in a particular spot in that chain, but our task remains the same; to live life with the Lord by hearing His Word and following Him. But make no mistake! In those seemingly mundane things the Lord is accomplishing His task that is of cosmic importance.

- 2. Opening Prayer was led by Pastor Matheny.
- 3. There was no public/congregational presentation.




TSNT meets Sundays October 8th and 22nd at 6:30pm in the Fireplace room. We will begin with time in God's

Here's an update on our Cameras and YouTube live-streaming.

The wires that transmit internet and television signal to and from our Audio/Video booth in the balcony have been disconnected. This is because they were on the flat roof, which we are soon replacing. These wires will be replaced as part of that project. Our cameras use Wifi to connect to our system so we are not able to live-stream church services. We were also in the midst of simplifying the system and updating software and that will continue accordingly.

The phone and Internet services for the building are also being updated including Fiber Optic.

You may ask "Didn't we just spend a lot of money installing new equipment?" Yes. Like all computers they suffer obsolescence as technologies are always changing. Our technical team is working hard to operate, maintain and improve this equipment. And, we are employing outside resources to assist in this process as is prudent. We appreciate your patience and understanding. This may still be a few weeks.

It is our goal to provide quality audio and video, assisting Pastor Matheny, Suzie, choir leaders, musicians, vocalists and organists so that you, our members and friends can cast your attention to worship of our Lord and Savior.

- 274 full container shipments of donated relief supplies and food were shipped within the United States and internationally

LCMS Stewardship Ministry: It's in the Way that You Use It

Consider the humble baseball bat. It is a simple tool designed for a complex task. The batter needs a tool that can consistently deliver force to a small ball which may be thrown at over 100 miles per hour, but which might also come slanting across the plate as a slow curve. For a game like this, the founders of baseball had to redesign the old cricket bat, which is more of a flat paddle. The tool had to fit the job.

But even a specially-designed tool can be used for a different purpose. It turns out that some years ago in England, the home of cricket, baseball bats suddenly started selling like hotcakes. What were folks across the pond doing with all those baseball bats? Using them as clubs in riots!

A tool can be used, and it can be misused. It's all in the way that you use it.

The same is true with the things of God. The Second Commandment states that we should "not misuse the name of the Lord." In the Small Catechism, Luther goes on to tell us exactly what this misuse is, as well as the proper use:

"We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." (SC I)

The Lord has given us His name: He has placed it upon us in Holy Baptism and He has invited us to pray to Him as our Father. In this sense, the Lord's name is something for us to use. We should not misuse it ... and we should not fail to use it. The Pharisees of old were so afraid of misusing the name of God that they decided to simply never say the name of God (YHWH, Jehovah) at all! This non-use is just as bad as misuse. The Lord gives His gifts for our use.

A Christian steward is one who is called to use all of God's gifts for His purposes. This includes things like the Name of God, the Sacraments and the Word, and it also includes things like our family and friends, our talents and skills, our money and resources. Everything that God has given to you, He has given to you so that you may be blessed to use it for His kingdom.

It's all in the way that you use it!
