Orphan Grain Train 2022-2023 Shipment Summary:

- 274 full container shipments of donated relief supplies and food were shipped within the United States and internationally
- 155 53-foot full semi-loads were distributed to domestic locations
- 119 40-foot full shipping containers went to 23 different countries overseas
- Humanitarian aid and food were shipped to 38 states and 71 countries
- More than \$44.1 million worth of donated humanitarian aid, food, and disaster relief assistance was distributed
- Total of 140,817.60 volunteer hours were given
- More than 5.4 million Mercy Meals, Kids Against Hunger meals, Manna Packs, and Harvest Meals were shipped worldwide
- 27 regional OGT locations from California to Connecticut collecting and distributing food and reusable goods worldwide
