From Pastor Matheny

"But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed." -1 Peter 4:13

Life is full of sufferings. Many of them are small such as a hangnail, a traffic jam, or too little air conditioning in the summer or too little heat in the winter. Others of them are much more serious such as major conflict with family or friends, the experience of war or famine, or the death of a parent or child. Yet most of these sufferings, both great and small, are normal. They are normal in that they happen in one form or another to everyone in our fallen world.

But in our memory verse for February (and in the section that surrounds it in 1 Peter 4) St. Peter is speaking not about sufferings that are normal to everyone but about sufferings that are particular to believers in Christ. Here he tells us that we are to "share Christ's sufferings". He is speaking here about any sufferings that we experience *because* we have faith in Christ. When someone mocks you for believing that our Lord walked on water or miraculously fed the 5,000. When someone breaks their friendship with you because you oppose the practice of abortion. When someone ignores your invitations to church, or suggests that participation in the Divine Service is fruitless, meaningless, or a waste of time. In all of these scenarios the saints of God share in the sufferings of Christ. And in these times St. Peter tells us to rejoice.

But how are we to endure such things? How can we possibly stand in a world that mocks, ridicules, defames, and ignores the church of God? To that question I simply remind you that we not only share in Christ's sufferings but we also partake of Christ's sufferings. When we gather together for the Sacrament of the Altar we eat and drink together the sufferings of our Lord. In that most holy meal we receive as a gift the presence of Christ Himself. That is how we are strengthened to stand in a world filled with sufferings. There is no way that of ourselves we could stand against the powers of sin, death, and the devil. But with Christ all things are possible. Rejoice that you share in and partake of the sufferings of your Lord and Savior Jesus.

- 1. President Dan Gahler called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.
- 2. Opening Prayer was led by Dan Gahler.
- 3. Public/congregational presentation: None
- 4. Bible Study: Luke 1 led by Zak Tess.
- 5. Additions/Approval of Agenda: Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda as amended, motion carried.
- 6. Council Minutes: Motion made and seconded to approve the December 12, 2023, Planning Council minutes as presented, motion carried.
- Pastor's Report: Dan Gahler read Pastor's Report which noted Christmas went well, positive comments on December 17th service with children's program, working on Lent preparation and excited for the year ahead.
- 8. Treasurer's Report: Doug Haeder provided summary of reports, followed by discussion. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.
- 9. Unfinished Business
 - 1. Hymnal Purchase: Next local Thrivent meeting is in April, the request to be presented at that time.
 - 2. Concordia Classical Academy Letter/Partnership Committee: Andrew Bittner has agreed to be on the committee, still need others to serve.
 - 3. Staff HSA accounts: Judd Schultz noted increase in health insurance deductible, which was not known until after the budget was approved. Motion made and seconded to approve increase to HSA contribution by \$200 for each staff member due to increase in deductible, motion carried.
- 10. New Business
 - Video and audio streaming update: Zak Tess provided updated on resuming streaming services, continuing to work on it, part of the delay due to not having internet in

the balcony during the roof project. It was noted dedicated funds received for updating and upgrading to support streaming services.

- 2. Minnesota Earned Sick and Safe Leave Time Policy: Due to new law, there is a requirement to have a policy speaking to sick and safe leave time. After discussion, motion made and seconded to approve the resolution as presented, motion carried.
- 11. Board Sharing:
 - 1. **Deacons**: Volunteers needed for Wednesday night meals and chili cook off is on January 21st followed by Bible trivia.
 - 2. **Trustees**: Updated phone system installed; 50% increase in insurance, seeking out quotes from other providers; and discussion about kitchen equipment needs. Motion made and seconded to approve trustees to confer with custodian about possible purchase of kitchen equipment up to \$2,000, motion carried. Motion amended and seconded to approve with the time limit of over the next month, motion carried.
 - 3. **Education**: Working on updating SMART goals; ideas for Wednesday night before Easter; and increase promotion of activities.
 - 4. **Elders**: Restarting the call process, reminder is it a slow process and working with Deaconess Brand on work and school balance as she pursues her PhD.
 - 5. **Endowment**: Next meeting in February and fund is doing well.
- 12. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Meeting adjourned at 8:09 pm. Next meeting is February 13, 2024 at 6:30 pm.

- 1. Meeting was called to order at 12:43 P.M. by President Matt Brand.
- 2. Opening Prayer was led by Pastor Adam Matheny
- 3. Approval of Agenda: Motion made, seconded to approve as presented the Agenda, motion carried.
- 4. Motion made and seconded to approve as presented the November 19, 2023 Voter's Meeting minutes, motion carried.
- 5. Unfinished Business
 - A. Roof Project and Fundraising Update: Steve Annis, Board of Trustees, provided an update, only punch list items left, project was within budget and approximately \$93,000 raised for project. President Brand thanked the congregation for their generosity.
 - B. Sanctuary Art Project: Karee Bless provided an update on the project, including the survey results. The survey results noted favorable to placement of art on side walls, enthusiasm for art and importance to edify the space. There was discussion about potential themes and placement of the art. Based on feedback from the congregation, the committee will continue moving forward and encourage continued feedback. The committee will develop themes to present at the next Voters' meeting.
- 6. New Business
 - A. Officer and Board Members Elections: President Brand noted changes to the slate. There were no additions to the slate from the floor. Motion made and seconded to vote on ballot as a slate, motion carried. Motion made and seconded to approve ballot as amended, motion carried. The installation of officers and board members will be in January.
 - B. 2024 Annual Budget: Doug Haeder, Treasurer, provided recommendation of council to approve budget. Mr. Haeder

noted correction to the social security taxes to non-called positions. Judd Schultz, Board of Elders, provided explanation for salaries. Motion made and seconded to approve as amended the 2024 budget, motion carried.

LCMS Stewardship Ministry: Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but *help and support him in every physical need*" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.
