President's Letter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past year for our Bible study time at Planning Council meetings we have been reflecting on individual Psalms. While the Psalms are generally rich sources of wisdom, praise, and honest conversations with God, one particular Psalm stood out to me. It is recorded that Psalm 118 was a favorite of Martin Luther, and one can understand this when reading the Psalm and reflecting on his life. It also is also very much worth reflecting on for the modern church. In verses 8-9 we read:

It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in man.
It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in princes.

We are faced with turmoil in the world, societal changes that are opposed to the Word of God, worries in our community and congregation, job challenges, illnesses, and the list goes on. It can be all too easy to trust in ourselves instead of God, and depair. What joy (and challenge!) to be able to take refuge in our God!

In 2021 and into early 2022 our congregation participated in the Re:Vitality program to help focus our efforts. This process led us through examining the core values of our congregation, and from this the creation of mission, purpose, and vision statements. The past year and a half we have been focusing on the goals that were a direct outcome from that process. The boards and committees have done a great job in moving these directives forward. Thank you! As was discussed during this process, our congregational goals should be regularly evaluated and revised. That process will be undertaken this next year. It is our hope that many will participate in this planning, so watch for additional information.

This past year included the request for a graduate seminarian to serve as a second full-time pastor for our congregation. Unfortunately a graduate was not placed with us, and we continue the call process this year. We give thanks for our current staff, and look to supplement these talents with long-needed additional support. We pray that we are able to successfully call a second pastor this year. Thank you to the Elders and call committee for the past and future work on this effort.

For several years we have been deliberating on the repair or replacement of the flat roof portion of our facility. In 2023 the Trustees and our custodian Bob Baker determined a full replacement was the best value option, and contracted for the work to be completed. We have been able to raise sufficient funds to avoid needing a loan for the work, and are substantially through raising money for this and several other recent projects. Your generosity is greatly appreciated as we care for the facility we have been provided.

I began this brief annual summary with a reminder from the Psalmist that we are to put our trust in God. It is my prayer that we do just that this year, and strive to walk in the light,

discern what is pleasing to the Lord (Eph 5:8-10), and do the good work. Psalm 118 closes with the following praise:

You are my God, and I will give thanks to you; you are my God; I will extol you.
Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!

- 5. Unfinished Business
 - A. Roof Project and Fundraising Update: Steve Annis, Board of Trustees, provided an update, only punch list items left, project was within budget and approximately \$93,000 raised for project. President Brand thanked the congregation for their generosity.
 - B. Sanctuary Art Project: Karee Bless provided an update on the project, including the survey results. The survey results noted favorable to placement of art on side walls, enthusiasm for art and importance to edify the space. There was discussion about potential themes and placement of the art. Based on feedback from the congregation, the committee will continue moving forward and encourage continued feedback. The committee will develop themes to present at the next Voters' meeting.

New Business

- A. Officer and Board Members Elections: President Brand noted changes to the slate. There were no additions to the slate from the floor. Motion made and seconded to vote on ballot as a slate, motion carried. Motion made and seconded to approve ballot as amended, motion carried. The installation of officers and board members will be in January.
- B. 2024 Annual Budget: Doug Haeder, Treasurer, provided recommendation of council to approve budget. Mr. Haeder noted correction to the social security taxes to noncalled positions. Judd Schultz, Board of Elders, provided explanation for salaries. Motion made and seconded to approve as amended the 2024 budget, motion carried.
- C. Called Staff Position Descriptions: Mr. Schultz noted item added to the meeting as informational based on feedback from congregation. Mr. Schultz provided the explanation of the development of the position descriptions, noting they are reviewed every two years.

It has been another busy year for the Trustees. Along with general maintenance that has been done throughout the year around the church, we also completed various projects. These include:

- Completed hiring process of Bob Baker as the church's new custodian. Bob successfully completed obtaining a Boiler's license.
- New custodian completed a great deal of painting throughout the building; sealed up holes to keep bats out; painted stripes in parking lots; and purchased Trustees' – approved new battery-operated line trimmer, leaf blower, and hedge trimmer. Bob also completed a great deal of additional, much needed, general maintenance throughout the church building and grounds, assisting others with removal of some shrubbery and refurbishing the courtyard with new plants.
- Stripping and waxing of floors in Fellowship Hall and Fireplace Room; shampooing of carpets.
- Cleaned all upholstered chairs in Fireplace Room.
- Replacement of old circuit boards in custodian closet and upstairs per instructions from the insurance company.
- State of Minnesota boiler inspection. Hard-wire of air compressor was required and completed.
- Boiler Room: Addition of water alarm per instructions from the insurance company.
 Replacement of sump pump with additional spare pump purchased. In 2024, new fresh air intakes for boilers will be installed.
- Voter-approved new, cost efficient plan to REPLACE versus repair the flat roof surface areas of building. This project came in on budget. In 2024, the ceiling areas where previous roof leaked will be painted.
- Cost of insurance coverage for the church building and Workers' Comp increased by \$10,000 for year 2024. Our carrier is Grinnell. We are working with the church's insurance agent, Thad Simpson, Simpson Insurance Agency, to get this back to a more reasonable cost.
- Remodel of the Pastor's office, per donation by a church member, approved by Board of Trustees. Work will be completed in 2024.

Board of Endowment Annual Report - 2023

We thank Dianne Schmidt for her service on our board the last four years. The newly elected member who will serve on our board is Thad Simpson.

The Endowment Board's objectives are to promote and receive contributions and manage the monetary gifts and bequests. These funds are invested with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Foundation for long term growth and income. Currently the funds are invested as follows: 62.5% equities and 37.5% bonds. Please consider making a contribution to our Endowment Fund. You may also name Our Savior Lutheran Church Endowment Fund as a beneficiary in your will.

As our Endowment Fund continues to grow and generate investment income, it will significantly help the mission and ministry of Our Savior Lutheran Church now and in the years to come. Both the principal and income can be used for projects, programs, scholarships and mission activities. Endowment funds are not intended to be used for the congregation's operating budget.

This year the Board continued to provide \$3500.00 for the "Adopt-A-Student" program at Concordia Seminary in St Louis, MO. The student receiving these funds this year is Sam Hoag. He is in his final year at school and will receive his first call to be a pastor this coming April.

This past year the Endowment board started using a Scholarship Application form for students who want to apply for a scholarship. We provided \$12,000 in scholarships to pay 50% of the tuition cost for 7 students from our congregation who are attending Concordia Classical Academy in North Mankato. We also provided two post-secondary scholarships of \$2500 each to Sarah Bjornstad and Naomi Brand. Both of these students are members of our congregation and are preparing for careers in full time church work. We also awarded a \$1000.00 scholarship to Terrin Boozikee, a teacher at CCA, for her LCMS colloquy program classes.

This year the board provided \$2000.00 to support Vance Becker, who is a missionary with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. He and his wife are serving in Kenya, Africa.

Our board holds quarterly meetings at the church in January, April, July and October. The September 30, 2023, treasurer's report is the most recent report available. The December 31, 2023, treasurer's report will be available the end of January.
