From Pastor Matheny

"Whoever despises the word brings destruction on himself, but he who reveres the commandment will be rewarded." -Proverbs 13:13

God's Word is where we hear what God says. We hear from God when we see Christ dying for us and learn that God wouldn't even spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all. We hear from God when we hear the Lord Jesus say, "Take and eat. Take and drink..." each week in the Divine Service and we learn the Christ is in the sacrament for us to eat and drink for forgiveness, life, and salvation. When we read or hear or study God's Word as recorded in the sacred scriptures we learn many things that our Lord would say to us not only for our salvation but also for the blessing of our lives here and now.

This month's proverb reminds us that God's Word is a blessing to all who hear and revere it. God in His Word reveals that He made the world and the fullness thereof and that as its creator He has plans and purposes for its flourishing. He teaches us how we should live in ways that will make our lives fruitful with blessings not only for ourselves but for our families and our neighbors. When we fail in how we live God in His Word calls us to repentance and faith that despite our failures we can find forgiveness in Christ and His church.

It also warns us that if we despise God and His Word by rejecting it or ignoring it we pave the way for our own destruction and the destruction of our families and neighbors. Without God's Word we will certainly make shipwreck of our lives and the lives of those we love. And even worse than that, without God's Word no one can know of God's call to repentance or of the forgiveness offered in Christ. Without regular reception of God's Word there can be no faith.

Take this proverb to heart and hold fast to God in His Word. Treasure the gift of the scriptures and the sacraments. Receive regularly the many gifts that the Lord has for you in His Word.

We don't get very far into the Bible before we have the first murder, and so begins the story of the killing of the innocent. We hear the directive to kill baby boys at the time of Moses. The attempts to kill David. Thankfully not everyone succeeds as is also the case in Esther. Children are sacrificed to false gods. The lack of justice and murder of the prophets depict the character in the Old Testament. Certainly no one is without sin except Jesus, but actions are taken without just cause.

The New Testament doesn't look much better. Herod, learning of the birth of a new king, orders boys two and under to be killed. Later it's the religious leaders plotting against Jesus. His followers face similar challenges. The martyrs wait in heaven for the rest to join them.



From the Stewardship Committee: Mercy and Grace Lead to Generosity

"Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift" (2 Cor. 9:15)! This is St. Paul's exclamation upon hearing the Corinthian church's response to the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and his request for support for the church in Jerusalem. The Christians in Corinth heard and received God's mercy in Christ, and they responded to St. Paul's call to support Christians in Jerusalem with a collection. The Corinthians' joy filled Jerusalem's need.

This is the reality of stewardship. Because of God's generosity in the giving of His Son to die on the cross for us, we are to be generous with all that we receive from Him. What do we receive? Everything. All that we are and all that we have is the Lord's. He is the creator and the giver. We are His creatures and those who receive what He gives.

It sounds easy. And it is. But then again it isn't. Stewardship is easy because it is God's work. Through what God gives, we give to others. Through what God gives, we support the work of the church for the life of the world. He gives; we receive. And like our generous Father in Heaven, we, as His children, use what He gives to us to love and serve others.

But stewardship is also difficult. That is because it goes against our natural inclination to think that what I have is mine to do what I want with. This is our sinful nature. It is our selfishness and our greed. How can we who have been given everything life, food, clothing, house, home, forgiveness, divine sonship, an eternal inheritance — be so stingy with what we give to the church, the place where we hear about and receive all that God gives us and does for us? We are all guilty of this kind of thinking. And the only godly response is to repent and trust in the Gospel.

For if God has given you His own Son, will He not give you all things? Yes. He will. This is His sure and certain promise. God provides for His people. He provides everything we need for this body and life and for the life that is to come. The church is a mercy place. It's a place where God's mercy in the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, is given and received. For us who believe it means forgiveness, life and salvation in the face of sin, death and the power of the devil. Here in the church, we inhale God's mercy in Word and Sacrament, and exhale this same mercy in love and service to our neighbor. And that is an enduring, joyful thing to do. Our joy fills our neighbor's need because His joy filled ours (Heb. 12:2). Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift!
