But the one who endures to the end will be saved.”

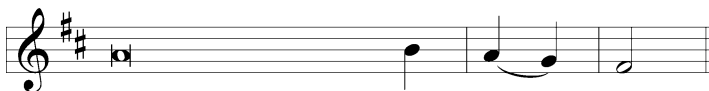
